Options for Accelerating MIQ Network Transition Cabinet paper

- 1. An updated draft Cabinet paper is at **Annex 1.** This incorporates changes made since the last version provided to your office on Wednesday 2 March [2122-2838 refers].
- 2. Talking points are attached in **Annex 2**.
- 3. We understand that the Treasury are likely to indicate to the Minister of Finance that their preferred option if vaccination requirements are retained is Option 2 (consolidate to three or four facilities, extend contracts until December 2022), or Option 3 (decommission all facilities by 30 June 2022) if vaccination requirements are removed.
- 4. As previously noted, with 21 facilities due to be empty by next week and a large workforce with an uncertain future, it is critical that this decision and the associated public announcement are made as soon as possible next week.

Changes to paper from feedback

5. A number of minor changes have been made to the Cabinet paper to reflect feedback from your office, other Ministers, and other agencies.

- 6. Costings for each of the three options have been included, consistent with your direction. It has also been made clearer throughout the paper that any unspent funding will be returned to the centre, even if the financial implications of all policy decisions are not yet sufficiently clear to include in the paper.
- 7. Minor editorial changes and corrections have been made.
