

## Proposed response to the Petitions Committee - petition of Juliana Carvalho - Let Arianna stay in New Zealand

#### **Purpose**

This paper attaches for your consideration a proposed Government response to the petition of Juliana Carvalho – Let Arianna stay in New Zealand.

#### Recommended action

The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (the Ministry) recommends that you:

- a Note that the Petitions Committee has referred an immigration-related petition from Juliana Carvalho – Let Arianna stay in New Zealand to the Associate Minister of Immigration for response on behalf of the Government
- b Approve the proposed Government response to the immigration petition from Juliana Carvalho (attached in Annex 2), which includes advice that you will not revisit the original decision on this case made by the previous Associate Minister of Immigration Hon. Phil Twyford.

#### **Background**

- 1. A petition from Juliana Carvalho was presented to Parliament on 4 May 2022, titled 'Let Arianna stay in New Zealand'.
- 2. The petition requests that:
  - "the House of Representatives urge the Associate Minister of Immigration to exempt Arianna Alfonzo from the Acceptable Standards of Health policy and grant Arianna residence so she can live with her parents in New Zealand and note that 4,179 people have signed an online petition to this effect."
- 3. The full petition is attached as Annex 1.
- The Petitions Committee wrote to the Ministry on 16 June 2022 requesting that the Ministry provide a written submission commenting on the issues raised, with a deadline of 15 July 2022.
- 5. Before the Ministry could make a submission however, the Petitions Committee referred the Petition directly to the office of the Associate Minister of Immigration (the Associate Minister) on 28 June 2022 to provide a response from the Government on the issues raised in accordance with Standing Order 380:

#### Standing Order 380: Referral of petition to Minister for response

- (1) The Petitions Committee may refer a petition to a Minister for response.
- (2) If a petition has been transferred to another select committee, that committee may request that the Petitions Committee refer the petition to a Minister for response.
- (3) In referring a petition to a Minister for response, the Petitions Committee may draw attention to any matters arising from the petition that the committee considers should be addressed in the Minister's response.
- (4) When a petition is referred to a Minister for response,
  - (a) the petition is discharged from the committee that was considering it:
  - (b) the Minister must respond to the petition within 60 working days:
  - (c) the Minister's response is presented to the House by the Minister as a parliamentary paper.
- 6. Responses to petitions are considered to be Official Government responses and follow the standard process for these<sup>1</sup>.
- 7. A proposed response to this petition was provided to Hon. Phil Twyford in his previous capacity as Associate Minister of Immigration, who provided feedback to the Ministry. Unfortunately, due to a process issue, there has been a delay in sending a revised response back to the office of the Associate Minister. The Ministry apologises for this delay.

#### Information on the petitioner

- This petition was written and submitted by Juliana Carvalho and Migrants Against the
   Acceptable Standard of Health Actearoa, in collaboration with Lorigail and Allan Alfonzo, the
   parents of Arianna Alfonzo.
- Ms Carvalho has presented a number of petitions on disability and immigration-related issues in the past and has received responses from both the Ministry and the Government.
- Ms Carvalho was declined residence under the Skilled Migrant Category due to her having a condition (paraplegia) that is deemed to impose significant costs and/or demands on New Zealand's health services. The previous Associate Minister granted her residence by way of Ministerial Direction in 2020.

#### Specific circumstances stated by Juliana Carvalho in the petition

- 11. The subject of the petition, Miss Arianna Alfonzo, aged 12, has a significant disability. Miss Alfonzo's parents are permanent residents of New Zealand, but Miss Alfonzo currently resides in the Philippines. Miss Alfonzo's father is currently onshore, and her mother has been offshore since 4 June 2018.
- 12. Miss Alfonzo's visitor visa application was declined in 2018 due to not meeting an acceptable standard of health on education cost grounds. Miss Alfonzo was not included in her parents' residence application.
- In March 2022, the Hon. Phil Twyford, in his previous capacity as Associate Minister of Immigration, declined to intervene and grant Miss Alfonzo an exception from the Acceptable Standard of Health (ASH) requirement, and a visa.
- 14. This petition submission was put before the Hon. Barbara Edmonds in April 2023 who requested further information about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNROC). (Hon. Phil Twyford had previously been briefed regarding the role of New Zealand's international obligations in decision-making related to immigration cases. This included obligations under the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child).

#### Proposed response

- 15. The Ministry has drafted a proposed Government response to the petition based on the circumstances of this case, which is consistent with past responses on this issue.
- 16. The proposed Government response is attached as Annex 3. The response covers:
  - a. immigration health settings
  - New Zealand's obligations under the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities
  - c. details on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child
  - d. requests for Ministerial Intervention.
- The response also notes that you will not revisit the original decision on this case made by the previous Associate Minister of Immigration Hon. Phil Twyford.

## Risks and mitigations

- 18. The Ministry does not consider that the petition raises any risks that require mitigation.
- 19. The proposed Government response, if approved by you, will be made public.

#### **Next steps**

20. Subject to your approval of the proposed response, the table below sets out our recommended timeline and process for responding to the petition.

Milestone/Activity	Timeframe
Ministerial Consultation	29 May – 12 June 2023
60 working day deadline for response	The initial deadline was 19 September 2022. Unfortunately, as noted in paragraph 7, there has been a delay in this Petition being sent back to the office of the Associate Minister by INZ.
