Self-contained Motor Vehicles Legislation Bill: Proposed Supplementary Order Paper Relating to Transition Period and Homelessness

Portfolio Tourism

On 29 March 2023, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee:

- noted that the Self-contained Motor Vehicles Legislation Bill (the Bill) was reported back to the House on 2 March 2023;
- 2 **noted** that there are substantial risks about whether the new freedom camping regulatory system, as outlined in the Bill, will have sufficient capacity to cope with the number of self-contained vehicles that will need to be certified during the transition period;
- agreed that the ability to extend the current two-year transition period in the Bill, by Order in Council, for a maximum of 24 months be progressed, via Supplementary Order Paper, through the Committee of the whole House stage;
- 4 **noted** that the policy objective is for those experiencing homelessness not to be penalised under the freedom camping rules;
- 5 **noted** that the existing definition of freedom camping in the Bill covers the living conditions of those experiencing homelessness, but that enforcement officers are encouraged to apply discretion and not infringe people experiencing homelessness;
- agreed that a legislative exemption for those who reside in New Zealand, and are living in a motor vehicle or tent out of necessity be progressed, via Supplementary Order Paper to the Bill, through the Committee of the whole House stage;
- 7 **noted** that a separate Supplementary Order Paper incorporating the recommendations in the Departmental Report on the Bill will also be progressed;
- 8 **invited** the Minister of Tourism to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the decisions under DEV-23-SUB-0034.
