#### **3. OPERATIONAL UPDATES**

#### 3.1 INZ operational priorities

#### **Accredited Employer Work Visa**

Incoming Accredited Employer Work Visa (AEWV) volumes have been progressively increasing since early February 2023, rising sharply last week and over the weekend peaking with 1,245 applications received on Friday.

As at 10pm 28 February 2023, there were 13,576 AEWV applications in progress. Over 81 per cent of these applications have been submitted since 1 January 2023 and 67 per cent submitted in February.

This was expected in the lead up to the new median wage increase coming into effect on 27 February. Policy change generally drives volume into the system and in this case, it is likely employers were encouraging employees to submit their work visa applications before the change, so they do not have to pay the new median wage rate.

In addition, the general instruction for streamlined processing of job check applications came into effect in August 2022 and Immigration New Zealand (INZ) began processing job checks in higher volumes at that point. As a result, a growing number of job checks are now expiring, and employers are likely encouraging employees to submit their work visa applications before the job checks expire. This has also likely driven volume into the system.

This week, INZ expects to see a gradual decrease and stabilisation in incoming volumes. On Monday 27 February, incoming volumes dropped to 208 applications received. At 5pm on Tuesday 28 February, 105 applications had been received and 398 decisions had been made. This has contributed to a reduction of overall in progress applications between Monday 27 February and Tuesday 28 February of 280.

If we continue to see reduced incoming volumes as expected, the overall in progress volumes should reduce to under 13,000 in progress by Wednesday 8 March.

Despite the increase in overall in progress applications, most applications are not yet available for immigration officers to assess and decide as the recent applications will still be progressing through the front-end system integration activities (e.g., identity, health, and character).

As the recent surge in applications works its way through the system and becomes available for immigration officers to assess, INZ is pivoting resource back to AEWV processing.

INZ public communications will be adjusted given the high volumes to manage customer expectations and reinforce messages about the importance of completing applications accurately and providing all necessary information. This messaging will reiterate that the new Recovery Visa will still be processed in seven days.

All AEWV support, identity and health activities are being prioritised, streamlined processing remains in place and overtime continues every weekend. Any further changes to operational and risk settings and processes would put the integrity of the immigration system at risk.

#### **Accredited Employer Work Visa applications**

A manual review of applications from October is currently underway to determine if applications can be progressed to decision, or if they remain in progress for valid reasons (e.g., third country police certificate, or medicals that required further testing).
