Thank you for your email of 5 December 2024 to the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

Would you please share all the advice including legal advice, memos, correspondence, emails, policy documents etc that brought about the decision to remove this page from the MBIE website under the OIA.

Please find attached the documentation relevant to your request.

In relation to the decision to remove the Vaccination Assessment Tool page, we review all the content on business.govt.nz annually. We use Google Analytics data and feedback and ratings from site users to assess the usage and performance of a page. We also use user feedback and ratings of the content to assess the helpfulness and relevance of the page to our audience. On top of these metrics, we take direction from the Minister and relevant government agencies on changes to our content. This is often necessitated by changes in legislation, priority focus and policy.

Following direction from the Minister's Office to update the page following the revocation of the COVID-19 Public Health Response (Vaccination Assessment Tool) Regulations 2021 (the Regulations), the Vaccine Assessment Tool page was amended to include a banner explaining the removal. In our review of the page in December 2023, traffic to the page was very low (26 views from 23 users over 19 months). Given the low traffic to the page and the revocation of the Regulations, the Vaccination Assessment Tool page was removed.

For reference, please note that the views metric is the total number of times the page is viewed, and this can be by the same person. The user metric is the total number of unique individuals who have visited the page. The user metric is the data we use to measure the performance of the page and how popular it is, as this represents individual page views, not potentially one user viewing the page multiple times.

Please note some information has been withheld under the following section of the Act:

9(2)(a), to protect the privacy of natural persons, including that of deceased natural persons


I do not consider that the withholding of this information is outweighed by public interest considerations in making the information available.

Cabinet have agreed today to revoke the regulations for the Vaccination Assessment Tool.

Given the tool lives on bus.govt we wondered if it would be ok to do the following on the site:

- News story on Business.govt to say it officially being revoked (mid-April) and to encourage businesses to follow the risk assessment process. Process is drafting and we'll send it across for you to have a look at in draft form and again once it's been through the signoff.
- The Minister's Office have asked for this news item to be live on Wednesday can you please let me know if this is ok?
- We will need to make some small tweaks to the copy on the Vaccination Assessment Tool page Privacy of the Will draft tomorrow and send through once Privacy of the Will draft tomorrow.
- Once the regulations have been revoked (mid-April) we wanted to discuss where the Tool might live (for people that may need to reference it in future noting that is will no longer be valid but say an Employer has a PG raised against them they may need to refer to it. So we would want it to be searchable but not something we'd actively promote.

Subject: New guidance for employers - vaccination requirements [UNCLASSIFIED]

Firstly congrats on your awards last week – so well-deserved!

I wanted to let you know that we have some new guidance hoping to go live tomorrow afternoon on the biz.govt and Employment NZ sites. This is currently being approved.

This is to support businesses in deciding if they want to add a vaccination requirement into their workplaces and the steps they need to follow.

Minister Wood is also looking to promote this tomorrow afternoon through a PR so there may be interest and we know businesses have been waiting for this guidance from government.

Attached is the PR and key messages and reactive Q+A. Once you've had a read let me know if there's anything additional that you need.

Information for the Service Centre: Changes to the Vaccination Assessment Tool (VAT) 5th April 2022

Following changes to public health advice, the Vaccination Assessment Tool will now be removed. Formally this involves revoking the COVID-19 Public Health Response (Vaccination Assessment Tool) Regulations 2021.

Key messages

- The Government has agreed to remove the Vaccination Assessment Tool (by revoking the COVID-19 Public Health Response (Vaccination Assessment Tool) Regulations 2021).
- The regulations are intended to be revoked on Tuesday 19th April which means businesses are recommended to no longer use it for health and safety risk assessments. The decision to revoke the tool is based on updated health advice.
- The Government introduced the Vaccination Assessment Tool as a simple and effective way for businesses to determine with certainty whether it was reasonable to require a vaccination in their workplace.
- Since then, the risks associated with COVID-19 have changed and updated public health advice is that vaccination requirements are now likely to be appropriate only where there is a greater risk of contracting and transmitting COVID-19 in the workplace than there is in the community.
- Employers may still be able to maintain vaccination requirements, however these requirements would need to be supported by a full work health and safety risk assessment. The circumstances where vaccination could be required are likely to be more limited than they have in the past.
- For businesses that have validly undertaken a health and safety risk assessment using the vaccination assessment tool, any employment decisions (such as terminating the employment of unvaccinated workers) that have already been made based on this assessment stands.
- Any employer currently involved in an employment process based on a vaccination requirement that was put in place using the vaccination assessment tool is recommended to pause that process. The employer should then undertake a full work health and safety risk assessment to take in to account the current public health advice before proceeding with any further employment processes.

Is this an admission the Vaccination Assessment tool didn't work?

Workplaces wanted a simple and effective tool that gave them certainty around whether they could require a vaccination, and the tool delivered that. Since then, the risks associated with COVID-19 have changed and updated public health advice is that vaccination requirements are now likely to be appropriate only where there is a greater risk of contracting and transmitting COVID-19 in the workplace than there is in the community.

Does this mean decisions made previously to require vaccinations were done illegally? Any decisions that were made using this tool still stand if they were made when the Vaccination Assessment Tool was valid. Business who used the tool will need to update their health and safety risk assessment reflecting the change in status to the tool.

Employees will still be able to bring a personal grievance if they feel they have been unjustifiably dismissed or disadvantaged as a result of a decision their employer has made about vaccination.

Why did it take so long to make a decision around the Vaccination Assessment Tool? MBIE kept business up to date with the fact the Vaccination Assessment Tool was being reviewed following updated public health advice. It was made clear there would be some change and businesses were strongly encouraged to wait for the Tool to be updated before introducing a vaccination requirement in reliance on it.

Scrapping of the tool is sending a strong message that essentially there's very few grounds for vaccination mandates in the workplace?

The latest public health advice is that the public health justification for requiring vaccination is stronger when the risks of contracting and transmitting COVID-19 in the workplace is higher than it is in the community. Employers may still be able to maintain vaccination requirements, where these continue to be supported by a work health and safety risk assessment, but these circumstances are likely to be more limited than they have in the past.
