The attached Cabinet paper is part one of a wider package of proposals to reform the health and safety system

- 1. The attached draft Cabinet paper outlines an initial suite of legislative amendments (and one operational improvement), comprising the following five key shifts:
 - a. A New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) led project to end the proliferation of road cones;
 - b. Sharpening the purpose of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (HSW Act) and its boundaries to focus the system on critical risks from work;
 - c. Limiting health and safety duties for small, low-risk businesses to reduce unnecessary costs;
 - d. Improvements to Approved Codes of Practice to increase certainty about what to do;
 - e. Freeing up recreational land use on private and public land to reduce landowner fears.
- 2. The proposals in this paper will be included in an omnibus Bill that you intend to introduce in October this year.

- 3. This paper is part one of a package of four Cabinet policy papers to reform health and safety. Other papers to come will address issues with WorkSafe and sector-specific pain points and seek final policy decisions to be progressed through the Bill.

10. In a previous version of the draft Cabinet paper, recommendation 2 stated:

note that the Minister of Transport and I will **instruct** WorkSafe and the New Zealand Transport Agency to work jointly on ensuring their temporary traffic management guidelines improve safety while reducing costs and disruption to people's journeys through right-sizing the guidance to the risk of specific traffic scenarios, on a continuum from state highways through to local roads;
