# **Commerce Act Review: Changes to Improve Competition Settings**

#### Portfolio Commerce and Consumer Affairs

On 25 June 2025, the Cabinet Economic Policy Committee (ECO):

## **Background**

- noted that in September 2024, ECO agreed to a targeted review of the economy-wide competition settings in the Commerce Act 1986 [ECO-24-MIN-0206];
- **noted** that public and targeted consultation was undertaken between December 2024 and April 2025 on options for reform [ECO-24-MIN-0261];

#### Supporting beneficial collaboration

- agreed to introduce a statutory notification regime to allow firms to notify proposed collaborative conduct and proceed unless the Commerce Commission objects;
- 4 **agreed** to provide the Commerce Commission with a new class exemption power to proactively exempt classes of collaborative conduct;
- **agreed** to provide the Commerce Commission with discretion to waive or reduce clearance and authorisation fees where it considers it appropriate to do so;
- agreed to streamline the beneficial collaboration clearance process by clarifying that the Commerce Commission need only assess the conduct's purpose and whether cartel provisions are reasonably necessary, without also assessing broader competition impacts;
- agreed to allow clearance and authorisation to be granted for collaborative arrangements with changing participants over time;

#### Strengthening enforcement and information handling

**agreed** to amend the Commerce Act 1986 to enable the courts to issue performance injunctions requiring parties to remedy contraventions of the Act;

- **agreed** to strengthen protections for confidential information provided to the Commerce Commission by:
  - 9.1 empowering the Commerce Commission to issue confidentiality orders over classes of information or documents with terms and conditions, specifying who the order applies to, extending the orders for a 10-year period post-investigation, and aligning the maximum penalties with those under section 103 of the Commerce Act 1986;
  - 9.2 limiting the disclosure of information supplied to the Commerce Commission in the course of its functions to a requester under the Official Information Act 1982, subject to a 10-year sunset clause;
  - 9.3 introducing anti-retaliation/victimisation protections for persons providing information or complaints to the Commerce Commission, modelled on those in the Protected Disclosures (Protection of Whistleblowers) Act 2022;

### Minor and technical changes

- agreed to the minor and technical changes, set out in paragraph 28 to the paper under ECO-25-SUB-0098, to improve the clarity and workability of the Commerce Act 1986;
- invited the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the above decisions;
- authorised the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to make minor or technical changes to the above policy decisions, as well as additional policy decisions consistent with the general policy intent of the paper under ECO-25-SUB-0098, on any issues that arise during the drafting and passage of the Bill through the House.
