Ticket Reselling in New Zealand: Release of Discussion Document

Portfolio Commerce and Consumer Affairs

On 13 February 2019, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee (DEV):

- 1 **noted** that the discussion document *Ticket Reselling in New Zealand* (the discussion document) outlines and seeks feedback on the key issues, objectives and potential options related to ticket reselling;
- 2 **noted** that the potential options outlined in the discussion document are as follows:
 - 2.1 maintain the status quo;
 - 2.2 price cap on resale tickets;
 - 2.3 information disclosure requirements;
 - 2.4 ban on ticket-buying bots;
 - 2.5 joint industry-government initiatives;
- 3 **agreed** to release the discussion document and the associated consumer summary, both of which are attached under DEV-19-SUB-0012, for public consultation, subject to any minor or technical amendments that may be required;
- 4 **noted** that the discussion document and consumer summary will be released for public consultation for a period of six weeks;
- 5 **invited** the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to report back to DEV by 31 October 2019 on the outcome of this consultation and any proposed policy changes.
