### 2. Regional Updates

#### 2.1 Top of the South

#### PipeDrive update

As of 20 February 2019, 28 applications and EOI have been lodged in PipeDrive. The status of those applications is:

- 1 is being assessed
- 9 have been approved
- 9 have been declined, withdrawn or are unsupported
- 5 are awaiting further information
- 1 is on hold
- 3 are waiting assessment.

#### **Regional Activity**

On 4 February, forest fires broke out in the Tasman district. The tires escalated and continued, resulting in a Civil Defence State of Emergency being declared. At present there are still homes and businesses that cannot be accessed.

Following the fires, the extreme drought conditions continue to keep fire risks high across the region and are causing significant water and other restrictions. These are severely impacting horticulture, forestry, seafood processing, tourism and related economic sectors. Government agencies have been working to respond to the immediate situation and ongoing drought implications.

A Labour and Skills hui is planned for Marlborough on 21 February as part of the Marlborough Smart and Connected economic strategy.

The Omaka Aviation Heritage Centre business case has now been completed and submitted as the final deliverable for this contract.

Upcoming Announcements

The 2077 Te Tauihu Regional Growth Strategy has now been signed and is ready for announcement once the Minister's Office advises.

#### 2.2 Hawkes Bay

#### **PipeDrive update**

As of 20 February 2019, 92 applications and EOI have been lodged in PipeDrive. The status of those applications is:

- 11 are being assessed
- 20 have been approved
- 18 have been declined, withdrawn or are unsupported
- 4 are awaiting further information
- 14 are on hold
- 25 are awaiting assessment.

#### **Regional Activity**

#### Local Authority Applications:

There are four local authorities in the region who have five applications being assessed by the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF). Central Hawke's Bay District Council and Wairoa District Council have three projects which have been contracted with the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE). We are currently considering water security and food innovation applications from the Hawke's Bay Regional Council and Hastings District Council respectively. Water security is a key concern for the region.

#### Private Sector Applications://

There is a large technology services provider who is evaluating potential sites for a contact/support centre in the Hawke's Bay. Their visit to the region was supported by two of the district councils, other government agencies and the local training organisation.

Regional PDU staff continue to engage with a broad range of organisations interested in PCF funding support. There are a number of applications from local iwi groups which the PDU are progressing in a diverse range of areas such as technology, One Billion Trees, hemp, land improvement, and skills and training programmes.

#### Upcoming Announcements

A package announcement is planned for 5 April 2019 comprising regional investments, sector priorities, infrastructure, skills and training.

#### 2.3 Waikato

#### **PipeDrive update**

**Regional Activity** 

Commercial Information - application withdrawn

The Waikato Business Summit will be held on 27 February at the Hamilton Gardens and includes presentations from the Hon Grant Robertson and also the CEO of Te Waka, Michael Bassett-Foss.

Tainui Waka Tourism with support from Te Waka and Hamilton Waikato Regional Tourism Office will host a one day Cultural Tourism symposium on 5 March at the Don Rowlands Centre in Karapiro The purpose of this workshop is to develop a Cultural Tourism package for the region. Te Waka has identified Cultural Tourism as a priority and a game-changer for the region.

The region is still facing challenges around labour shortages and transitioning youth into training and employment, and the approval of the Smart Waikato application was well received. Whilst Te Puni Kokiri lead our cross agency work in Hamilton City, we are working with a provider, <sup>Commercial Information</sup> to develop their programme into Commercial Information</sup>. They have submitted their application to He Poutama Rangatahi.

We are working hard to ensure there are a suite of projects across Whenua, Employment and Skills and cultural tourism that can potentially be announced at Field Days in June.

#### 3. Other updates

#### The Maxim Institute Paper release

The Maxim Institute (the Institute) has written a paper titled: *Smarter Specialisation: Ensuring the PGF is a Risk Worth Taking,* which is to be released on 26 February 2019.

The paper discusses aspects of regional development policy (referred to therein as 'spatial policy'), including elements of best practice, describes the PGF, and compares it to what the Institute considers best spatial policy practice. In deing so, they have drawn a number of conclusions, many of which are critical of the PGF or its underlying processes. These include:

- a concerning lack of collaboration and co-ordination across the current regional development strategy;
- undue risk created by a sector-based investment approach; and
- a lack of evaluation and ongoing monitoring of significant funding initiatives.

We have engaged with the Institute (through the author, Julian Woods) and provided feedback. We have been informed that much of this will be included.

The Institute intends to provide us an embargoed copy of the paper on the morning of 25 February 2019
