
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1. Dashboard updates

2. Regional Updates

2.1 Canterbury

PipeDrive update

As of 24 April 2019, 42 applications and EOI have been lodged in PipeDrive. The status of those applications is:

- 10 are awaiting assessment
- 2 are being assessed
- 1 is awaiting further information
- 5 are on hold
- 12 have been approved
- 12 have been unsuccessful declined, withdrawn or are unsupported.

Regional Activity

The funding agreement for a second urban bridge in Astiburton has been executed. The Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) is contributing \$94,250 towards the Confidential cost of the detailed Business Case. The key drivers for the project are economic growth and productivity resulting from improved travel time reliability, network resilience and improved road safety are.

On 14 March, Provincial Development Unit (PDU) officials met with the consultant working on the PGF-funded feasibility studies for the Kaikōura District Council. The focus of the work is a commercial proposition for the redevelopment of the harbour and a commercial partnership between the Council, Whale-watch and other potential stakeholders.

PDU officials met with Confidential information entrusted to the Government

to discuss the Confidential information entrusted to the Government

proposal and other potential PGF applications.

PDU officials met with Te Puni Kōkiri (TPK), which has commissioned work on business cases for three potential applications for PGF funding:

- information

PDU officials met with Environment Canterbury to discuss the Hekaeo/Hinds Groundwater Replenishment Scheme PGF application. The PDU is assessing this application in consultation with the Department of Conservation (DOC) and the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI).

The business case for the Ashburton Second Urban Bridge will be released on to the Provincial Growth Fund website shortly.

Planned Future Activity

Visits to Canterbury (Kaikōura and South Canterbury (Timaru and Mackenzie Districts)) are being planned for the near future.

2.2 Manawatū / Whanganui

PipeDrive update

Regional Activity

Ruapehu District Destination Plan

The Ruapehu-Tongariro Tourism Development Programme is one of the first deliberate destination management approaches as identified in the Government Tourism Strategy. The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) and DOC have agreed on a way forward for this programme and are taking a dual approach to implementation.

MBIE and DOC are engaging with ive to encourage participation and develop relationships.

The Team Government hui to discuss the long-term visitor plan is scheduled for 10 May.

A cross-agener team has developed a draft work programme for the Development Manager with Ruapehu District Council (RDC). A hui with iwi is planned for 24 April and the week commencing 30 April. An industry development meeting is planned for 6 May.

Skills and Employment

This is a major focus for the Manawatū - Whanganui region. This is being led by the Accelerate 25 Skills and Employment sub-group.

A third meeting took place on 22 March to discuss further plans for the Manawatū-Whanganui Skills and Employment Hub. The Sector Workforce Engagement Programme (SWEP) is coordinating this.

Representatives from Ngāti Kauwhata iwi will be part of both the governance group and the operational working group for the proposed hub. Ngāti Kauwhata will propose a name for the hub.

3. Other Updates

3.1 Digital Connectivity

Marae Digital Connectivity

The Marae Digital Connectivity project is part of the \$21 million announced by the Government in February to ensure that New Zealanders in the regions can access modern and reliable digital services in their community. This project also aligns with Regional Digital Hubs.

The project has been live for six months, during which time the process, procedure and policy mandate for the project have been created and confirmed. The project is a collaboration between the PDU, TPK and Crown Infrastructure Partners (CIP), with regular project team meetings including officials from all three Covernment agencies. The relationships and administration support that TPK has provided to the PDU has been integral to the success of this project.

In order to apply, marae must submit a consent form, showing that two trustees of the marae who consent for the marae to be connected to broadband, as well as an online survey including social and cultural readiness criteria. Marae from any region can apply, excluding the metro areas of Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch. Marae have been able to apply since the start of February 2019 and there are 55 marae from across the country so far that have submitted consent forms and filled out the survey. More than 200 marae have expressed interest in participating in the project.

Two of the 55 marae that applied have already been connected to broadband and were announced in Hokianga on 5 April. Around 70% of the 55 marae are ready to be connected within the next six months. We are working to advise all applicants of their expected wait time for connection. The remainder are currently on hold as the broadband roll-out has yet to reach their location; this will be fully completed by 2021, however many of these marae will be able to connect to broadband through the project before then.

For the announcement in Hawke's Bay within the next two months, there are 10 marae ready to be connected to broadband through the project, many of which are part of a Wairoa collective of marae who plan to be connected at once.

The feedback from marae involved in the project has been overwhelmingly positive, for many of the marae trustees and administrators they are excited to be able to offer digital connectivity to their rangatahi when they are hosting wānanga and other activities.

As the marae are connected through the project, PDU officials will provide Ministers with an update on marae that have been connected each month.

Regional Digital Hubs

The Regional Digital Hubs (RDHs) are place-based hubs where local businesses and other members of the community can access the internet and other digital services. They are designed to be a co-investment with local community, for example with local councils, economic development agencies or iwi. There will be between one and three RDHs per surge region (Northland, Bay of Plenty, Hawke's Bay, East Coast/Tairāwhiti, Manawatū-Whanganui and West Coast) with an investment from the PGF of up to \$400,000 each and are tailored to suit the region; PDU officials are working with different partners in each region to ensure the best spread and fit of RDHs per region.

One application has been submitted and approved for an RDH so far, by Taitokerau Fibre Network (TFN), with the first hub to be based in Kaitaia. The application was approved and the PDU is working with TFN to complete the contract for implementation.

PDU officials are currently working with local authorities in all of the other surge regions to identify possible partners and locations for the RDHs. All six surge regions are working with their local communities to identify the best placement of their RDHs and who will lead and partner in their development.
