PROPOSED OVERSEAS TRAVEL: HON IAIN LEES-GALLOWAY

- 1. I seek the approval of Cabinet to travel to Geneva, Switzerland from Sunday 15 June 2019 to Friday 21 June 2019 to attend the International Labour Conference (ILC).
- 2. The Prime Minister has approved the travel in-principle, and House leave will be sought, subject to Cabinet approval of the recommendations in this paper.

Purpose of Travel

- **3.** The ILC is the International Labour Organisation's (ILO) most important event. It develops and adopts new international labour standards, scrutinises the application of existing labour standards, discusses international developments in the world of work and approves the ILO's Programme and Budget.
- **4.** The 2019 Conference will run from 10-21 June. It will mark the 100th year of the ILO's founding (which New Zealand participated in) and will be a highly visible and significant global event expected to attract over 5,000 attendees, including labour Ministers and Heads of State from the ILO's 187 member States.
- **5.** The Centenary Conference will focus on the Future of Work and the drafting of a Declaration outlining the ILO's role in promoting employment and employment rights as it enters its second hundred years. A standard-setting committee will also conclude negotiations on a new International Labour Convention on preventing violence and harassment in the world of work, for adoption by the Conference.
- 6. The Conference will provide a unique forum in which to highlight New Zealand's workplace relations achievements and engage with Ministers and senior ILO and other officials on matters of mutual policy interest. New Zealand will be represented at the Conference by a tripartite delegation comprising the New Zealand Council of Trade Unions, Business New Zealand and MBIE officials.

Programme

- **7.** I propose to depart New Zealand for Geneva on Saturday 15 June where I will represent New Zealand at the International Labour Conference from Monday 17 to Wednesday 19 June. I will arrive back in New Zealand on Friday 21 June.
- 8. During my time in Geneva, I intend to meet with senior ILO officials, including the Director General, Deputy Director-General, Manager International Labour Standards and Asia-Pacific Regional Director. I also intend to meet with the heads of the International Trade Union Confederation and International Organisation of Employers. Within my Immigration portfolio, calls will also be made on the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and the International Organisation for Migration.
- **9.** I intend to deliver a speech to the Conference Plenary on New Zealand's achievements in workplace relations and attend plenary sittings and events.
- **10.** I also intend to engage with other Ministers at the Conference to reinforce existing high-value relationships, share experiences and discuss policy approaches to workplace relations issues in particular around collective bargaining and the management of diverse forms of employment relationships. Bilateral discussions will be sought with Australia, Canada, Ireland, Denmark and Chile.

Ministerial party

- 11. I will be accompanied by my Ministerial Advisor.
- **12.**Officials from the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade will also be attending the Conference. The costs of officials' travel will be met from within agency baselines.
