Minute of Decision

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Use of Fee Revenue Collected under the Companies Act

Portfolios Small Business / Commerce and Consumer Affairs

On 3 April 2019, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee:

- 1 noted that legal advice from the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MBIE) indicates that the use of fees collected to maintain registers under the Companies Act 1993 (Companies Act) to fund the activities of the New Zealand Business Number (NZBN) registrar is outside the scope of the fee-setting powers in the Companies Act;
- 2 **agreed** to retrospectively validate the collection and use, for NZBN registry purposes, of fees prescribed and collected under the Companies Act;
- 3 **agreed** to amend the Companies Act to provide that fees collected under that Act may be used to fund NZBN registry services and related functions, include information and education activity;
- 4 **agreed** to amend the NZBN Act 2016 to insert a regulation making power to enable all or some entities which have been allocated a New Zealand Business Number to be charged fees and levies for NZBN registry services and related functions;
- 5 **agreed** to funding of the NZBN information and education work programme from third party revenue to ensure the continued uptake and effective use of the register from 2019/20;
- 6 **approved** the following changes to appropriations to give effect to the policy decision in paragraph 5 above, with a no impact on the operating balance and net core Crown debt:

- 7 **agreed** to insert a provision by way of Supplementary Order Paper to the Insolvency Practitioners Bill to enable the Registrar of Companies to charge a levy to companies (and other entities that can be liquidated) for the provision of independent oversight of the Insolvency Practitioners regime;
- 8 **invited** the Minister for Small Business and the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to issue drafting Instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the proposals above;
- 9 **agreed** that a Bill giving effect to the solution be:
 - 9.1 added to the 2019 Legislation Programme with a category 2 priority (must be passed in 2019);
 - 9.2 introduced on Budget night;
- 10 **authorised** the Minister for Small Business and the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to jointly make decisions on any minor or technical matters that may arise during the drafting process.
