Recently the Metallica concert sold out in minutes, within days people have tickets for sale on trade me at inflated prices. I questioned trade me about this and suggested they were encouraging this practice of scalping by allowing this to happen.

Their response was that people who can't go to a concert should be able to re-sell tickets, which I have no problem with, but two days after you bought the tickets for a concert on 31 October (and its mid-march)?!

It is unethical, unfair and robs true fans of the chance to attend.

I honestly believe that if trade me had a policy of only allowing re-sale of tickets say 3 weeks prior to an event this alone would make a difference!

The way things are now scalpers will be banking their profits even before their credit card bill is due for the original purchase.

Are there other solutions that would work well?

In Australia ticket sellers offer buyers an opportunity to re-sell their tickets from that website.

So when you buy tickets from say Ticketek, there is a pre-announced re-sale date, this means that people who miss out on tickets have an opportunity to buy them in the re-sale and those who have tickets and genuinely cannot attend are able to re-sell them - at face value.

Another option is to insist that all tickets are named and to ask for ID at the gate, this would stop illegal re-sale as the ticket can only be used by the registered owner.
