# 2. Upcoming announcements

24 May	Carterton	Parliamentary Under-Secretary for Regional Economic Development Fletcher Tabuteau issued a press release announcing an \$800,000 grant for Wairarapa Water Ltd on 24 May 2019. Minister Mark made the announcement in Carterton on behalf of Parliamentary Under-Secretary Tabuteau.
		The grant contributes to the cost of a feasibility study to develop community water storage and distribution infrastructure for public and private use in the Wairarapa. The water storage facility would be located at Wakamoeku.
		A package of funding announcements will be made in the Hawke's Bay in the week starting 10 June which will bring social and economic prosperity to the region.
10 June	Hawke's Bay	Funding announcements will be made in the areas of regional capability building, infrastructure – roads, digital connectivity and water, skill and employment, One Billion Trees, as well as funding from Whenua Māori and Te Ara Māori programmes.
		The announcements will be made by Parliamentary Under-Secretary for Regional Economic Development Fletcher Tabuteau.
TEC		A \$948,000 He Poutama Rangatahi grant has been approved for Nga Pumanawa Tupuna. The grant is for a Youth Education, Training and Employment (YETE) partnership with the Wairarapa Rural Education Action Programme (REAP) and the Masterton District Council. Nga Pumanawa Tupuna is a joint work readiness initiative that will target 120 at-risk rangatahi Māori. Announcement details have not yet been confirmed.



#### 3.2 Kāpiti- Wairarapa

#### PipeDrive update

As of 22 May 2019, 40 applications and EOI have been lodged in Pipe Drive. The status of those applications is:

- 4 await assessment
- 7 are being assessed

- 19 have been unsuccessful declined, withdrawn or are unsupported.

#### **Regional Activity**

#### <u>Kāpiti</u>

On 30 April 2019, PDU officials met with the Kāpiti Regional Advisory Group, chaired by Kāpiti Coast District Council Mayor K Gurunathan and discussed a range of PGF applications from the region.

On 30 April 2019, PDU officials visited the Māoriland Hub in Otaki to follow-up on the completion of the architect's work (\$215,000 funded by the PGF) and their plans to submit an application to help develop the Hub as a centre for performing arts, film industry and creative industry events. The Hub would also serve as a meeting and event space for rangitahi, whanau and the wider community.

PDU officials are currently negotiating the terms of the contract with Omeo Technology for an approved \$3 million loan for the assembly of an innovative wheel chair which utilises Segway technology.

#### Wairarapa

On 17 May 2019, the Wairarapa Economic Development Strategy and Governance Group met, chaired by Lance Walker, CEO of Wellington Regional Economic Development Agency (WREDA). PDU officials provided an update to the group on the status of current PGF applications.

#### 3.3 Taranaki

#### PipeDrive update

As of 22 May 2019, 45 applications and EOI have been lodged in PipeDrive. The status of those applications is:

- 4 await assessment
- 8 are being assessed
- 3 await further information
- 3 are on hold
- 21 have been approved
- 6 have been unsuccessful declined, withdrawn or are unsupported.

#### **Regional Activity**

On 8 and 9 May 2019, the Prime Minister, Rt Hon Jacinda Ardern, and Minister of Finance, Hon Grant Robertson, attended the Just Transitions Summit held in New Plymouth. Around 500 delegates attended the summit from various organisations throughout the country and speakers from around the world delivered addresses. There was a strong emphasis on engaging with new energy technology and adopting low-carbon production processes for goods and services. The PGF was considered to be a key enabler to unlock new opportunities in the renewable energy sector and particularly to assist the region to adjust to a new economy while building on its existing energy and agricultural strengths.

Work has continued with various applicant groups on proposals to launch new energy technology or the infrastructure required to support it. These have potential to support Taranaki's regional economy through new employment opportunities for existing energy sector workers by offering low emission energy alternatives.

Commercial Information

State Highway 43 (SH43), the 'Forgotten Highway', links the Central Plateau and Taranaki. A portion of SH43 has never been sealed and this presents a significant barrier to attracting tourists, tourism opportunities and other economic offerings at each end of the road. Early in 2018, \$400,000 of PGF funding was announced to support a business case to estimate the cost of sealing of the road. The final version of the business case is expected from New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) in late May/early June.

The Council and a PDU official met with Ngāti Maru to test their perception of the proposal and whether there are economic aspirations they can pursue through the work. The meeting was positive and there is a plan to meet again.

#### Commercial Information

PDU officials will meet with the Department of Conservation (DOC) and an Iwi trust to discuss options to advance the aspirations of conservation trusts in the region. A meeting has been arranged with the Director-General of Conservation to discuss sustainable funding options for a potential training model.

In 2018, Venture Taranaki received funding from the PGF to support regional food opportunities. The PGF invested \$40,000 in four applicants to advance their product or business. Lesser amounts were given to a further three companies. The outcome of the investment is expected to be reported on by the companies in June, and presents a good opportunity to showcase the benefits of the investment made.
