# **Building (Product Certification) Amendment Regulations 2019**

Portfolio Building and Construction

On 10 September 2019, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

- noted that on 12 December 2018, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee agreed to amend the Building (Product Certification) Regulations 2008 (the Regulations) to require that:
  - 1.1 references to International Organization for Standardization (ISO) standards in the Regulations are up to date;
  - 1.2 all product testing laboratories are independently certified, to ensure the product tests used for CodeMark meet a minimum standard;
  - every PCB has an ISO certified quality management system in place, to ensure there is a minimum standard for all quality systems;
  - 1.4 (products are evaluated against all relevant Building Code clauses within Code clause B2 Durability and Code clause F Safety of users;
  - 1.5 product certificates include more information about a product, including its intended use and specifications, and additional information is carried over to a schedule on the certificate:

- 2 **noted** that the Building (Product Certification) Amendment Regulations 2019 give effect to the decisions referred to in paragraph 1 above;
- noted that the Minister for Building and Construction has made minor and technical changes to the Regulations consistent with the policy decisions to amend the Regulations;
- 4 **noted** that the consultation requirements under section 403 and section 409 of the Building Act 2004 have been met;
- **authorised** the submission to the Executive Council of the Building (Product Certification) Amendment Regulations 2019 [PCO 21974/10.0];

noted that the Building (Product Certification) Amendment Regulations 2019 will come 6 into force on 1 November 2019.
