Purpose

This briefing provides, for your feedback, a draft Cabinet paper seeking agreement to permanently remove the requirement for refugees being considered for resettlement under the Refugee Quota Programme from the Africa and Middle East regions to have a family member already in New Zealand (the family link requirement) from 2018/19 onwards.

Background

- 1. The requirement for refugees being considered for resettlement under the Refugee Quota Programme from the Africa and Middle East regions to have a family member already in New Zealand (the family link requirement) was introduced in 2010 [DES Min (10) 2/3]. Since then, it has been difficult to meet the Cabinet-agreed regional allocation of Refugee Quota places in these regions due to the challenges of identifying refugees with a family link in New Zealand.
- 2. In March 2018, you agreed that the family link requirement should be permanently removed from 2018/19 onwards [2428 17-18 refers].
- 3. Removal of the family link requirement needs Cabinet approval. A Cabinet decision is required in May in order for the change to be implemented for the 2018/19 Refugee Quota.

The draft Cabinet paper

- 4. The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) has drafted a short paper for consideration by the Cabinet Economic Development Committee (DEV) on 23 May 2018. The paper, which is attached in Annex One, seeks Cabinet agreement to permanently remove the family link requirement.
- 5. The draft Cabinet paper includes the following information:
 - a. the proposal to permanently remove the family link requirement from 2018/19 onwards;
 - b. background information on the Refugee Quota Programme and the family link requirement;
 - c. the impact of the family link requirement on the number of refugees that have been resettled from the Africa and Middle East regions since its introduction;
 - d. global refugee resettlement needs;
 - e. views of key stakeholders;
 - f. security and settlement considerations;
 - g. the steps that will be taken to implement removal of the requirement; and
 - h. upcoming Cabinet decisions on increasing the annual Refugee Quota to 1,500 places.
- 6. Talking points to support your discussion of the paper at the DEV meeting will be provided to you with the final Cabinet paper.

Consultation

- 7. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the Office of Ethnic Communities and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet have been consulted on the draft Cabinet paper and support the proposal. The Treasury has been informed.
- 8. We are seeking your feedback on the attached draft Cabinet paper (Annex One). We also recommend that you forward this briefing, and attached draft Cabinet paper, to the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the Minister for Ethnic Communities. You may wish to forward the draft Cabinet paper as it stands to your Ministerial colleagues; alternatively, you may have feedback that you wish to have incorporated before you consult with your Ministerial colleagues on the proposal.

9. In order to finalise the Cabinet paper before the lodgement date of 17 May for the 23 May DEV committee meeting, feedback that you wish to have incorporated before a revised version is provided for Ministerial consultation is required by 3 May. Alternatively, if you are comfortable to forward the draft Cabinet paper as it stands to your Ministerial colleagues, feedback is required by 9 May.

10. We are working to the following timeframes for lodgement and consideration of the proposal to remove the family link requirement:
