The devastating gas explosion in Christchurch recently highlights an issue we ignore at our perit. Residential piped gas is volatile, toxic and a powerful greenhouse contributor. Gas appliances consume oxygen and emit carbon dioxide and water vapour. If ventilation is poor oxygen levels begin to drop and the flames consume carbon dioxide, generating dangerous carbon monoxide. This can increase quickly to the point where the air becomes poisonous and continued exposure can affect our health and well being. Chemicals produced can trigger respiratory problems, depression, decrease the quality of your health and be potentially lethal.

Natural gas is a fossil fuel and although combustion may be cleaner than coal and oil, Methane – a primary component of natural gas – leaks from drilling sites and pipelines and is 34 times more potent than carbon dioxide at trapping heat in the atmosphere. While the gas industry may reject and confuse these claims the facts remain. Gas is a bad option in the home and environment, especially in a country rich in clean renewable electricity resources.
